Recently I received an Email message that Victoria British was looking for several cars to photograph. The covers of their catalogs usually feature a local car. But often even the owner has difficulty recognizing it. The colors are changed to coordinate all the covers for a given season. And the same car may appear in subsequent covers in a different color. Through the wonders of digital photo editing, accessories that Victoria British is featuring like lights or wheels or whatever may show up on the image of your car. But owners are still quite proud to see their favorite pampered possession gracing the cover of an internationally published catalog. It ain't the Rolling Stone or a Playboy centerfold but it comes darn close.

Our Midget was on the cover several years ago so I knew the drill. You clean the car's exterior and remove all the personal items that the camera might see if that can be done easily. Then you drive to the photo studio trying not to pick up too much dust and dirt along the way. It is with great sorrow that we said good-bye to long time Kansas City MG Car Club member and MG enthusiast Sanford “Sandy” Krug, 79, of Prairie Village, Kansas. He passed away Saturday, January 21, 2012. Sandy was born August 18th, 1932 and was a lifelong area resident who graduated from Paseo High School and served in the United States Air Force, attaining the rank of Sergeant. He worked in the family business, Osage Iron & Metal Co. prior to owning and operating Olson Industries for over 25 years before his retirement.

Sandy was an avid antique car collector and exhibitor receiving multiple regional and national awards. He was fixture in all things cars in the Kansas City area for years. His beautifully restored white and grey 1938 MG

TA Tickford took top awards at many local, regional, and national shows including the first National MG gathering of all the registers in 1996 in Indianapolis. While probably best known for the Tickford, he also owned many other British, foreign, and American automobiles. He was also active with the local Heartland MG Regional planning committee.

In addition to cars, Sandy's passions included bowling, golfing, boating, and music. He was a member of The Temple, Congregation B'nai Jehudah, the Kansas City MG Club, the New England T Register, The Car Guys, Jazz Ambassadors, and a lifelong member of B'nai B'rith and its bowling league. He was preceded in death by his parents and his wife, Jacquelynne Krug. He is survived by his wife, Barbara Krug; 9 children, 14 grandchildren; 2 great-grandchildren, and a sister.
