Midget Mumblings

On the way home from the club social the other night, I noticed the left wipers on the Midget didn't winkle. Once home in the garage, I tried the hazard switch and everything winked just like it was supposed to. My assumption was that the dang hazard switch had gone bad like it did once before. So with great difficulty, I removed that to take a look. With great ease, I broke the little plastic thingie that holds it together and then looked inside. It was clean and seemed to function. My test meter confirmed it did all the things the wiring diagram said it should. So I checked the wiring around the switch and it too seemed intact. Eventually, I moved on to the turn signal switch and checked with my meter to see if that could possibly be the problem. And only half of it seemed to work.

The turn signal switch is tucked inside the plastic clamshell that surrounds the steering column. At least on late Midgets, you have to remove or at least greatly lower the whole steering column assembly to get access to the screws that hold the clamshell on. Getting that done will make a preacher cuss! Eventually, I got down to the switch and removed it. It took a while, but eventually I could see the problem. One of the metal spring whiskers that completes the circuit was broken off. No repair seemed possible.

Since I can no longer just drive 30 minutes to Victoria British, pick up a new switch, whine about the poor quality of replacement parts, whine about the increase in price, and drive home with the new part in hand; I sat down at the computer and ordered up a new one. Now I can wait several days for delivery and whine about the cost and delay of shipping. I sure hope I can remember how all those pieces I removed go back together. We should have been nicer to Victoria British when they were still in business!
