Finances are open to inspection at any time and the Treasurer provides financial statements that show how the membership's money is spent. Officers and Registrars receive no financial remuneration for their duties, but volunteer out of the spirit of the marque. The award-winning magazine *MG Driver* is published six times a year. 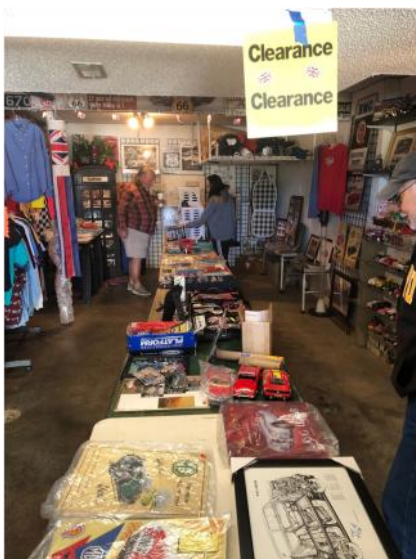

Midget Mumbblings

My 1976 Midget is just barely an MG at all. It may share tail lights and some other small components with the MGB, but that is about all. Back in the middle 1950s, Donald Healey noticed that the common Brit didn't have an affordable sports car available. He set out to fill that need.

He knew the dimensions of that average seated Brit, so he penciled those in to start the design. He also knew the size of available tiny 4 cylinder engines, transmissions, wheels, and such. Leaving no extra space, he added those to his drawings. Then he drew a simple body to surround those components. He was a designer, not a car builder. He had no factory and to keep cost to a bare minimum, he planned on using off-the-shelf components for almost everything. He shopped around to find the most available and affordable. Once his design was completed, he went looking for a factory to build it for him. The result was the Austin Healey Frogeye Sprite. Those eyes were designed as flip-up headlights, but that cost too much. That cost savings made the car look even cuter.

Pressed Steel took on the job of building the bodies. MG had capacity to do the assembly. The market welcomed a car that filled an empty gap. As cute as the Frogeye was, it wasn't perfect. So the Box Sprite was designed to improve on the few weaknesses. And while they were thinking about the minor face lift, why not badge engineer an MG version? The bare bones little car was selling well in America and MG had a larger dealership network. And quickly the MG version outsold the almost identical Sprite.

And the final blow to make the MG Midget even less of an MG came with the 1975 models. Tightening emission rules meant a larger displacement engine was needed. The 1275 had been stretched about as far as possible. A fresh engine design would be expensive. And now MG and Triumph were both part of one big unhappy family. Triumph had an engine the right size in the Spitfire and it was already emission approved. It was a wise business decision to plug that into the Midgets as well. So now the Healey-designed car had a Triumph engine and transmission. It wore an MG badge, was made in Abingdon, and was sold by MG dealers, but was it really an MG?

I don't much care. The car may be a mutt instead of a purebred, but I enjoy owning and driving mine.



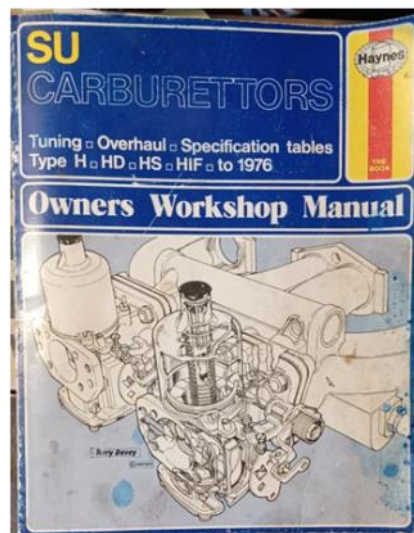
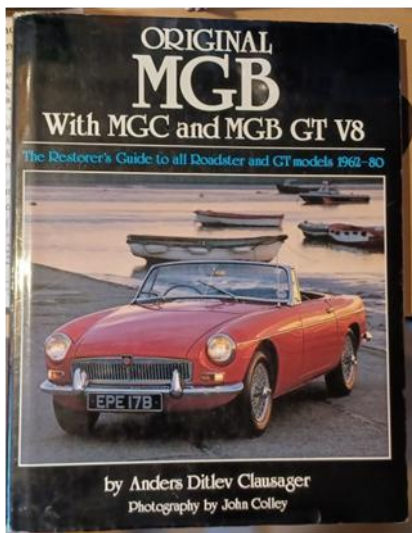


LOANER LIBRARY

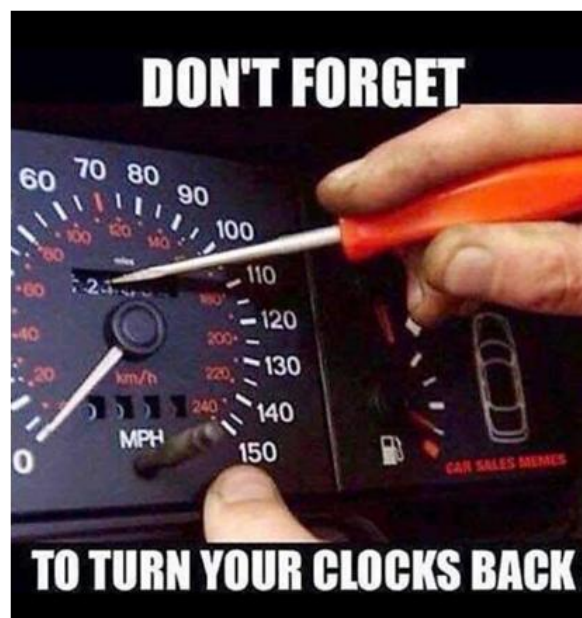
