I am pleased to announce an opportunity once again to tour the Armacost Studebaker Car Museum at 10 am on March 9, 2024. The address is 4200 E 135th St, Grandview, MO (Peterson Manufacturing).

Admission is free, but donations to the museum are accepted and appreciated as this is a private museum set up for fundraising events. If you wish to donate, there will be volunteers there to answer questions about that.

The first chance to do this occurred when one of the restoration people called me for parts in the early 2000's. I asked them if I could bring our club members over to see the British cars they had on display and they were gracious enough to agree. I am not sure if they have added to the stable of British cars, but they did have an early '20's Rolls-Royce limo, an MGTD, a '62 MGB, Sunbeam Alpine, several Ferraris, and of course copious amounts of Studebakers. If memory serves me, I believe there are 78 cars in total. Some of these cars are so rare, one would be hard pressed to find even some in other museums. We have a real gem right in our own backyard.

I know many of our members have not had the opportunity to see this museum that under normal circumstances can only be seen by participating in corporate fundraising events.

This Month In MG History

Abingdon Spares January Newsletter

This month in MG History... December 1970, the last drawing entry for ADO21, and work on the project would end soon. ADO was British Motor Corporation code for Austin Drawing Office, (there are other interpretations of this acronym). In the late 1960's ADO21 was BLMC proposed replacement for the MG Midget and the Triumph Spitfire. ADO21 was to be designed by Abingdon as a mid-engined corporate sports car. Triumph was to work on the replacement for the MGB/TR6. Extensive development work included installing a 4 cylinder engine transversely in an MGBGT. Modifications to the suspension, cooling and fuel systems were fabricated at Abingdon. As often happened at MG, the corporate parts bin of available engines did not offer the "perfect fit". The chosen 4 cylinder engine, with its transmission mounted underneath in Issigonis style, proved difficult to package in the mid-engine body. Abingdon rose to the challenge however, the final design was a very modern mid-engined sports car. Like its predecessor, the MGA, this would have been quite a shock to the MG traditionalists. Somehow, during its development, ADO21 became to be viewed as a replacement for the MGB, it was even shown in drawings as an MG D. This probably was not in its favor, as the Triumph dominated management had already decided the MGB replacement (if there actually was one planned) would be some version of the TR7 or "Bullet" project. Over 600 drawings were produced for the ADO21 project between November 1969 and December 1970, including full size models, before the project was dropped. With the cancellation of ADO21, Abingdon now had no in house replacement for either of its most popular models. With BLMC management favoring Triumph, the evolution of the TR7 as the corporate sports car was obvious, and the future of MG was not nearly as certain as it had been just a few years previous.

Why was ADO never fully developed beyond the drawing and modeling stages? BLMC management did favor the Triumph projects. The tall 4 cylinder engine worked better with Triumph's front engine, rear drive proposals for a small sports car. Also, it was not in the proposed emissions certification program that was already in the works for the American market. Finally, customer resistance to the mid-engine design was probably the final knock against the design, decidedly ahead of its time.

Midget Mumblings

I usually don't make New Year's resolutions because I know I won't follow through with them. But for 2024, I decided I would work harder on my personal safety in the garage. I don't have a fancy dedicated shop to work in, just a 2-car attached garage full of junk and cars. And it lacks the height needed to install a lift. I am too cheap to buy a lift, even if I had room. Our British cars never have a reason for me to see the underside except for an oil change. Well, I wish that were true.

To get under my cars I use what the Brits call a trolley jack (floor jack on this side of the pond) I remember when American cars had strong enough bumpers that we raised them up using the factory-supplied bumper jacks. Those were great until they tilted sideways and the car came crashing down. Mine once did that when I was under it and I was lucky to be able to squirm out without serious injury. A trolley jack is much safer, as long as it is on a firm footing and is pushing up on a solid part of the car. My cars are unibody, so there is nothing much underneath solid enough to lift up on. For the rear of the car, I position the jack under the center of the differential. Up front, the front cross member is just heavy sheet metal on the Midget, but it is already bent and wadded from previous owners, so I lift from there. My car is so low that even if it didn't have a DIY spoiler, there is no way to get the jack to roll under from the front of the car. But I can just squeeze it in from the side in front of the wheel.

Only when I am lifting both ends of the car do I use jack stands. I have three pairs of stands, but my favorite is a pair of stamped sheet metal ones that were considered unsafe, even when they were new five decades ago. Having been bent and hammered and bolted back together a few times, they are probably even less reliable today. But they are a few inches taller than my others, so they are the ones I use most often. They fit reasonably well under the front leaf spring shackles. I end up with the bottom of the car about 16" off the garage floor. Supported in three places by the stands in back and the jack in front, the car is pretty stable. That makes almost enough room for me on my low-slung antique creeper. Most say never trust a hydraulic jack. I have had them fail before and mine is one of the cheapest and made of aluminum in some foreign country. But when a seal fails and the oil comes spewing out, it isn't usually instantaneous. Anyone paying attention should be able to get out of the way as the car comes down.

But I now resolve to do a better job of remembering that after I get the car raised up and before I crawl under it, to give it a **good hard shake** just to be sure all is secure. That should improve my odds of being able to make more resolutions next New Year.

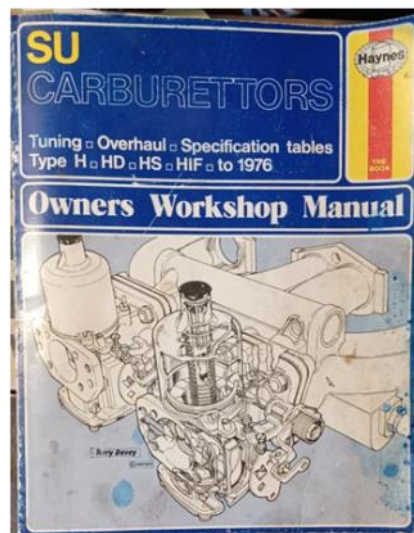
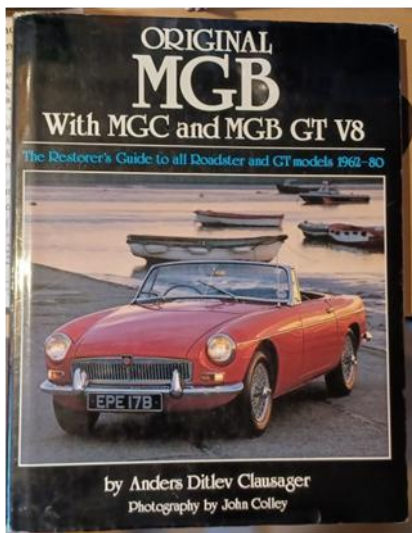


