HopeKids is an organization for families of children dealing with life-threatening illnesses. Many such organizations exist, but HopeKids takes a unique approach. What HopeKids does differently is include the entire family. At HopeKids events, which include museum visits, sporting events, theater performances, private movie screenings, prince and princess parties, superhero breakfasts, and so much more, the entire family comes together to feel some normalcy.



HopeKids provides a place for sick children and their families to come together and experience the best parts of community and childhood.

Of course, not every family has such a happy ending to their struggle. Another thing that sets HopeKids apart is that they continue to support the family in the event that they lose their child.

HopeKids provides a wealth of opportunities for these families to be families. They provide family portraits twice a year. They partner with local stables to provide equestrian experiences, from grooming to trail riding. Donors supply gifts year-round for a November gift market so that families can pick gifts for Christmas free of charge and before the holiday season. The organization has strong connections with the Royals, Current, Sporting KC, and Comets to get children out and even provide stadium tours.

The organization already serves 460 families but is looking to expand its reach – potentially four or five times over.

Surprisingly, half of HopeKids' funding comes from individual donors who see the impact the organization has on families. They put on 300 events, but 200 of them had a waiting list. A lot of events have a capacity of only 30 people. They want to increase that to 100 people.

While they will continue the work of spreading hope to families who need it most, they have just one ask of Kansas City: "Spread the word."

Abingdon Spares May Newsletter

This month in MG History...May 1950, This month in MG history....May 1950, the first production MG TD Midget Mark II, chassis TD/C/1123 launched. Mark II models, offering higher performance, are identified by TD/C chassis numbers. The Mark II was launched in USA in January of 1951. The Mark II was developed as the "competition" model, based on modifications made to a standard TD based on the experience and input of three "factory drivers" of the era.

Modifications to the standard TD to make the Mark II were based on three cars built for George Phillips, Dick Jacobs and Ted Lund. These three had raced factory supported TCs in 1949, and then moved into the modified TDs for the 1950 and 1951 seasons. Working with the three drivers, Abingdon made considerable changes to the TD. Modifications to the suspension included four Andrex shocks, larger carburetors, and twin fuel pumps were fitted. Changes were also made to engine compression. The standard single backrest seat was changed to twin bucket seats. (I have heard of these "competition seats", but have never seen a set on the several Mark II cars I know of. They do exist, but I wonder if they were not always included with every Mark II?) Overall, the factory produced over 44 individual drawings to cover the changes to make the Mark II as a production model. The Mark II was a successful racer in national and club level races, and it would lead to the next generation of MG models. George Phillips, who seemed to never be completely satisfied with Abingdon's efforts, would eventually have Abingdon re-body a TD with Mark II modifications into the Le Mans (EX172) racer. This car served as a 'pre-prototype' for the MGA!

Midget Mumbblings

MG 2024 is in the history books and I thought the show in Katy, Texas was well done. I take great pride in my First Place trophy but full disclosure, mine was the only car in my class. Of course, for me the journey is the most important part. All the cars in our little caravan of six cars from KC made it home under their own power, so the trip has to be considered a success. There were hurdles to be overcome along the way, but together we overcame all of them. I will list only the highlights of our opportunities as corporate leaders have told us to call problems.

Day one, my exhaust pipe broke in two and threatened to fall down onto the pavement. Calls to local muffler shops to get a fix late on a Friday afternoon were unproductive. Geoff Rollert thought with adapters and clamps from a parts store we might cobble up some kind of temporary fix. A nearby O'Reilly had a good selection and I bought a handful of stuff and we went across the road to a vacant church parking lot. I crawled under the car and Rick Mills and Geoff handed me parts and tools and kept 911 on speed dial. The navigators found a shady bench and waited patiently. They must have had a good visit because when we got back on the road and had driven a dozen miles, they discovered that Christy had left her glasses and Monica had left her phone (phone retrieved!). Meanwhile, the exhaust patch seemed to be holding but was far from leak-free.

We reached our motel and Dean Wheeler went to work on his inoperative brake lights and windshield wipers. A faulty wiring connector was identified for the wipers and the brake light switch was adjusted to work at least for a while. The wiring problem was not in a convenient location and he had RainX, so that was left for another time. And by then, it was starting to sprinkle. It rained all night leaving our parked cars a bit moist inside. And the rain continued as if it might go 40 days and nights. Much of the time, it came down in buckets and at 70 MPH, found its way into all the cars to one degree or another.

By now, Rick Mills' car had developed an ugly sounding exhaust leak and one of Dave Dobbins' wipers had disassembled itself. The downpour continued all night, but by morning, the sky was brighter. Geoff Rollert was doing better than expected in a car he had assembled only days before we departed. He was adding oil and coolant frequently, but the car was running well. As we drove on to Katy, we finally saw the sun and began to dry out.

In Katy, Rick found a shop to replace the lost studs in his exhaust manifold and I decided to live with my leaking exhaust in favor of attending tech sessions and doing some of the drives. The weather was perfect for the show. However, Dave's car died on the way from the show back to the hotel and its starter refused to spin. He got a tow back to the hotel and he and Rick went to work on it while the rest of us got ready for the banquet. The starter problem turned out to be poor wiring connections, or perhaps something that cured itself. But then, the car refused to fire. They worked on it till bedtime without success, no matter what ignition parts they changed. Come morning, I offered supervision and eventually noticed the rotor rotated freely on the distributor shaft. Spare rotors for an MGC don't grow on trees. But then a friendly local car owner appeared with a baggie of spare ignition parts and gave us a rotor. Of course, by then we had maladjusted the timing, so it took a while to get the flooded engine started and running correctly. By then, most of our party had been sitting in their cars waiting on us so we could start for home. In less time than it takes to read this, we finished packing, checked out of the hotel, and hit the road for home. We soon split up, having enough confidence in our machines to drive on alone. As far as I know, the only incident on the way home was me noticing a big crack in my windshield. The navigators seemed to enjoy all of our challenges a bit less than us drivers. But what fun would it be to drive modern vehicles that offered quiet comfort and convenience and almost never had mechanical issues? Next year, the event is in Illinois, so start now getting your car ready to attend.

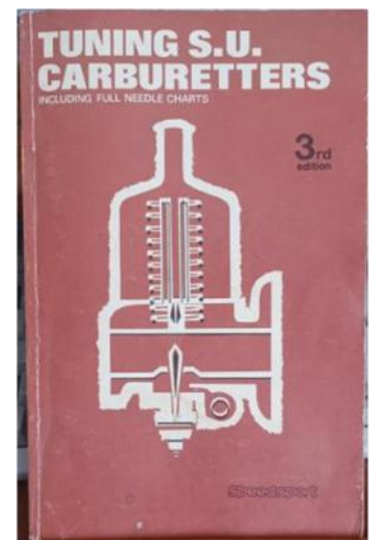
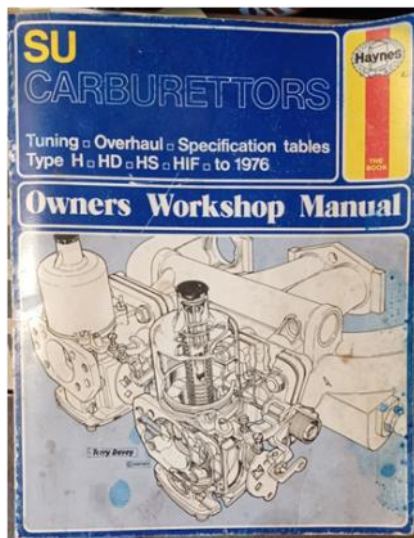
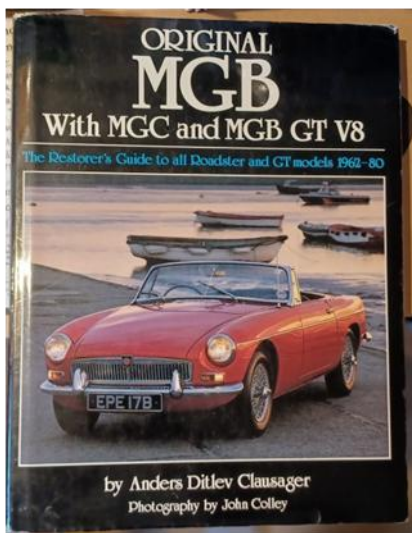


LOANER LIBRARY

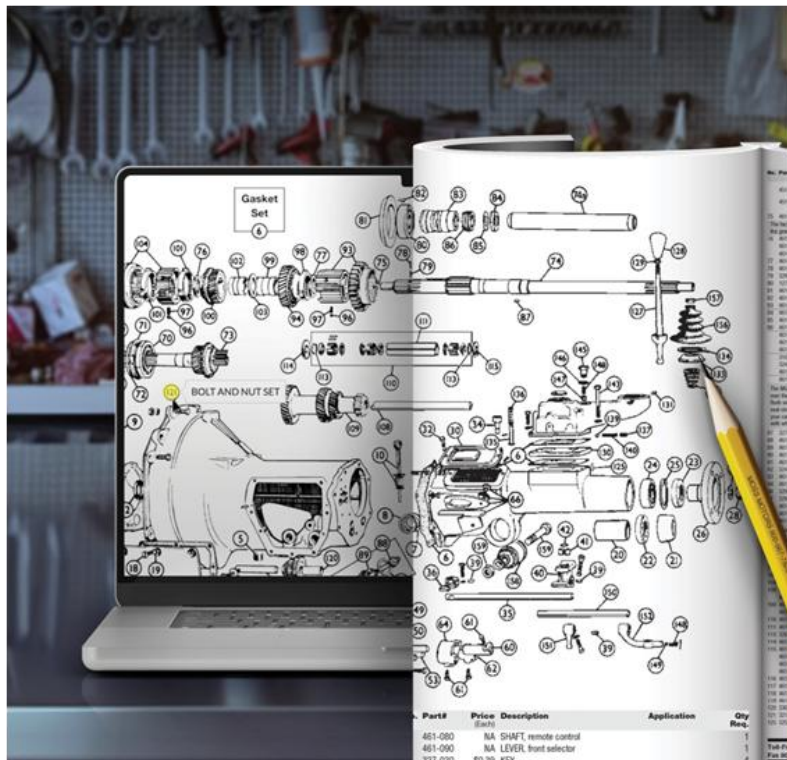
