Know Your Parts From Local Auto Parts Stores

This is an article I should have written a long time ago. I have heard of club members getting rebuilt starters and alternators at various parts stores in the city instead of waiting for shipments from Moss or British Parts Northwest or Rimmer. Did you know there are a lot of other maintenance parts available at your local auto parts store? Parts like valve cover gaskets, manifold gaskets, thermostats, brake pads, brake shoes, calipers, belts, u-joints. And most common are oil filters, fuel filters, and spark plugs.

What really got me going on this subject was pulling the engine on our '69 MGB. I thought while I have it out, I think I'll replace the oil pan gasket and other gaskets that are hard to get to with the engine in the car. I had two pan gaskets: a paper Payen and a Felpro. I keep lots of gaskets in stock. After fighting that so-called Payen paper gasket for 10-15 minutes, I threw it away; got the Felpro gasket out and not only did it fit, it's a much better quality gasket. So why did I start with the paper gasket? Well, our '69 MGB is not our primary car to drive, so I was saving the Felpro gasket for our '73 MGB/GT should I need it in the future. Also, Felpro manifold gaskets come with six carb gaskets that are NOT paper. They are a rubbery flexible gasket.

Quality is what I like, not price point. Remember, "Good is not always cheap, and cheap is not always good."



This Month In MG History

Abingdon Spares August Newsletter

This month in MG History...August 1932, the MG J2 Midget is announced, priced at £199.50. Considered by many to be one of the classic sports cars of all time. The J2 replaced the M, C, and D types. The chassis followed the D-type pattern, but the engine, gearbox, and body were

quite different. The J2 was a 2-seater; there was also a J1 which was the 4-seater version. (There were also J3, supercharged, and J4, all out racing car versions of the model.) The J2 was simple, with the cut-away door tops, double-humped scuttles, and the large fuel tank mounted vertically outside the rear of the body, with the spare wheel mounted behind the tank. The J2 was popular for trials and many were successful racers as well. The weak link of the J2 was the crankshaft. If run



at high speed for extended periods, the two-bearing crank suffered from vibration and broke. The engine was in a fairly high state of tune, producing roughly twice the horsepower of the original design. Further factory attempts for a cure were not helpful; obviously a new engine design was needed by the end of the J2 in 1934. Between 1932 and 1934, well over 2000 J2s were built at Abingdon, along with approximately 400 J1, J3, and J4 models combined. The original 1932 cars were equipped with classic cycle-type racing fenders. Although the cycle fenders gave the required 'racing look', they proved impractical for wet weather conditions. They were replaced in 1933 with what were called the 'swept wing' front wings, like the Magna and Magnette models of the period. This later J2 design, with the long bonnet, vertical slab tank, spare, cut-away doors, and the swept wings, would continue to be the classic MG look through the post war TC.



Midget Mumblings

Speedos. No, not the kind you wear to the pool, but the ones in the car indicating velocity. Lots of us complain about how our speedos are inaccurate or don't work. The one in my Midget is spot on at 60mph and the needle doesn't flop around. But it was not always so. Before you send your speedo off to one of the few rebuilders left in the country, let's think about potential DIY solutions.

If the needle flops around, you probably need a new cable. Maybe you can just lube the old one. They sell special graphite stuff just for that. I have had good luck with pulling the inner cable out, wiping it with plain old red grease, and stuffing it back in. May not fix the problem, but it is a cheap thing to try.

If you have replaced tires with ones of different diameter, or changed rear end ratios, you have likely noticed that your odometer and speedo are no longer close to accurate. There is some allowance for you to correct this by swapping the plastic gear located in the tranny where the speedo cable goes in. With only a few exceptions, our car's speedos expect to have the cable rotate 1,000 times for each mile driven. Different plastic pinion gears were once available and probably still are from some supplier. If your speedo reads too fast, then you need a pinion with more teeth.

Once you have the odometer indicating the same miles as the signs along the Interstate, you can address the speed. How could the speedo have become inaccurate? Perhaps while a bad cable made the hand wave like crazy, it came down and whacked into the zero pin a few million times. Each whack moved the hand on the shaft just a fraction of a degree. Or perhaps, some other idiot knocked the hand off and just randomly stuck it back on. Your GPS or smart phone app will show you your real speed and you can compare that to where the speedo hand is pointing. You might even be able to make minor corrections. The hand is not keyed onto the shaft. Just a round shaft with a snug fitting round hole in the hand.

The way a speedo works is that there is a hub on the same axle as the needle. Inside the hub are magnets that spin when the cable does. The spinning magnets attract the drum and make it want to spin also. There is a very delicate, hair-thin, clock spring tied to the drum that resists letting it spin. As the magnets spin faster, the drum is attracted to the magnets and overcomes some of the spring's strength and the needle rises. This bit of rocket science was figured out by our great great-great grandparents.

You could grab the hand and pull it straight off once you have the lens off the speedo. If say at 60mph, you were reading 65 or 55, you might be able to get it closer by just moving the needle in relation to the shaft. Have you ever noticed there is a mark or sometimes a dot on the dial a bit below zero? If you point the needle at that spot and slip it back on the shaft while the cable is not turning, you will be close to where the factory set it. Then you just need to very, very gently pry the hand past the peg and the spring will hold it down at zero. Or you could hook up the speedo and drive what your GPS says is 60 and then slip the needle back on the shaft while it is pointed straight at 60. That is essentially how I made the final adjustment on mine.

Just because I was able to do this hack successfully doesn't mean that I recommend you try it. I had a spare speedo just in case I ruined mine. But if you are brave/stupid like me, then take a shot. You can also move the needle on the fuel gauge or temp gauge the same way and perhaps adjust their accuracy. This one tiny bit of knowledge does not make you an expert. Just dangerous like me. Use this hack with care and don't call me if you screw things up.


Lake Garnett Grand Prix Revival "Save the Track" Repairs

SHOW UPDATE

Every car guy enjoys the occasional car show, especially when it's an all or mostly British iron. But did you ever think about how that show comes together? It seems so simple when you're there.

The Heartland All British Car & Cycle Meet, this Labor Day Weekend, has a small committee that works through the details of bringing approximately 115 cars together. The committee should ideally represent as many British marquees and clubs as possible, but involvement is now somewhat limited. More participation would be welcome. The current committee includes Roger Elliott, Steve Olson, Larry Taylor, Ed Curry; all members of both the Triumph and MG clubs, Kris Gamble; Jag Club, and Russ and Jane Amos; and Lotus owners. Roger chairs the committee. They meet monthly throughout the year to coordinate scores of details. In addition, about 12 day-of-show volunteers are needed.

Location is always first to be reviewed. Long-term show participants have seen the show move to many locations around the metro. When is the right time to move again? Municipal fees and insurance requirements vary in each location.

Online registration and payment on the show's website take months of trial and error to get right.

Announcement and registration are then sent to 400 LBC owners using a contact list that must be carefully maintained. Seventy new and fresh-looking awards have to be designed and assembled. This is the most expensive show element and must be kept to a reasonable budget and therefore an acceptable entrance fee.

Other things to organize are printed materials; show brochures, dash plaques, and voting ballots. Tee shirt design and ordering need to be done months in advance. Contracting for a food truck requires a minimum payment guarantee, rain or shine...so <u>buy lunch from the truck</u>. Table and chair rentals need to be delivered and picked up. This year, we're using a third-party service to do this. We've always had period-correct DJ music which needs to be arranged and set up. Thankfully BJ the DJ has been a trusted resource for many years.

The show's assets: a canopy, several Union Jack feathers, and a very large banner have to be maintained and stored. New this year is using a public storage facility. Swag bags have to be stuffed and labeled for preshow registrants with shirts, literature, and any items donated or purchased.

As with last year, we will again have a Pre-show Cookout and Boot Sale. Estimating and purchasing the food and cooking logistics add another large task.

Motorcycles have always been a part of the show, but lately, we have had few, if any, show up. So, to make sure they remain included, please encourage anyone you know with a British motorcycle to bring it to the show.

Careful budget management is an important consideration. Can we provide all show elements for a reasonable entry fee? A change this year is the desire to provide a donation to HopeKids, a local children's charity. This is a feature of many car shows.

When you attend the show this year, consider all the effort it takes to make it happen. The committee would welcome more involvement from underrepresented clubs and marquees. Enjoy the show, but if you would like to see it continue, get involved!
