A few months ago, I read *Confessions of a Teenage MG Driver* in the October 2024 issue of *Moss Motoring*. This is a delightful story about a teen and his 1975 MGB daily driver that he found to be "enriching, humbling, frustrating, and most of all, exciting." I fully relate to the story as I purchased my 1960 Triumph TR3 close to my 17th birthday and experienced many of the same emotions, joys, and challenges as the writer and led to a lifelong interest in British motoring. But what really caught my attention was a paragraph near the end where the writer states, "I urge you readers to support a new age of British car owners and their awaiting adventures by encouraging today's teens and young adults to join our ranks." Online sales platforms are littered with ads reading, "Solid car. Just never driven." I say, buy it! Buy it for your grandkids, nieces, and nephews, even for yourself. Encourage the inquisitive kid at a car show to sit in your passenger seat. Take young people for rides. Show up for parades and community events. Donate that unused parts car to a high school auto shop. Being an ambassador for British cars and inspiring the next generation to continue our hobby will ensure these fine little machines live on."

I started thinking about what, as a club, we can we do to increase younger generations interest in the ownership, driving, care, and maintenance of British cars. (I should note that "younger" is a relative term. In my case, it means not only teens and young adults, but also anyone 55 or younger!). Taking the long view, as our membership ages, we need younger members to continue the club and take care of our cars when we reach the point we can no longer do so. Increasing the interest in British motoring will help ensure a supply buyers, parts and mechanics, painters, and other craftsmen specializing in British cars.

This Month In MG History

Abingdon Spares January Newsletter

This month in MG History...January 1955, the Monte Carlo Rally. This would be the first factory sponsored rally team since the establishment of the Abingdon based BMC Competitions Department in December of 1954, under the direction of Marcus Chambers. Chambers was the first manager of the revised Competitions Department organized by John Thornley in 1954. Chambers came from HRG, a formidable racing team of the day, with much experience in European racing and rallying. Initially the mission of the Comps department was to see the various BMC models represented in as many types of competition to showcase the various Austin and Morris models.

In the 1955 Monte Carlo Rally, a team of 3 of the new MG Magnette ZA saloons was prepared by the new "Comps" department. The individual cars were named after the characters from the "Les Trois Mousquetaires" (The Three Musketeers) novel. (It has always interested me that there are four names associated with the three musketeers, but it is French, so be it.) The naming harks back to the NE Magnettes trials team of 1935. Magnette number 49, known as Aramis, finishes 178th overall, Magnette number 58, Athos, finishes 237th, Magnette number 36, Porthos, finishes 202nd, and a fourth Magnette, d'Artagnan was driven by Chambers. If these results seem less than spectacular, they were, and probably the reason Chambers decided to concentrate more on BMC models that had better possibilities of success. For the 1955 rally, consider that 319 cars were entered, from Aston Martin, Panhard, Mercedes, Jaguar, Lancia, Ford, Daimler, Sunbeam, Citroen, Fiat, Alfa Romeo, and many others. Only 272 cars remained at the finish, and all the MG team cars did finish.

The team of Magnettes was advised (unfortunately) to run with three man crews for the difficult winter rally. The cars each carried 500 pounds of spares, including snow chains, shovels, and a manual winch contraption. With the three man crew and all the extra spares, the 60 hp saloon was vastly underpowered.

The starting point for the MGs was Glasgow. Teams in this event had the freedom to chose which ever route they wanted between control points. However, roads were not closed to the public, and the exact location of the control points unknown. The MGs reached Dover after a 18 hour drive from Glasgow, icy and snowbound roads, and decisions about how best to cross the Pennines. Once across the channel, there was a easier run across France to Belgium. The second leg brought them through the Low countries to Amsterdam, where the local BMC dealer serviced the cars as well as the other teams arriving from Stockholm, Oslo, and Munich to this common point. From Amsterdam the route continued on to Paris. From Paris, the route descended down through the French Alps, mostly at night. This was quite an adventure as snow and ice covered most of the roads, with vertical drops off the side of the road with no guard rails at all. Chains were needed as there were three mountain passes of 4000 ft. to summit. Despite the teams valiant efforts, none of the Magnettes times were sufficient to make the top 100 and therefore did not qualify for the 325 km final stage. The three Magnettes were all assigned finishing places regardless. A courageous run indeed, who today would attempt such a run in a Magnette!

Midget Mumblings

Since the overdrive quit working back in September, I have not driven our Midget much. I attempted to solve the problem with the transmission still in the car. Especially on the later model J-type overdrives, almost everything that usually goes bad can be reached by removing the sump which is held on with just a few bolts. Mainly there, just O-rings that can be replaced if you can locate the right sizes. I had an assortment from Harbor Freight that contained most of what I needed, or at least they looked about the right size. And my local Ace Hardware had matches for a few that I didn't have on hand. Over time, the O-rings harden and don't seal as well as they should. The fact that I have tried most every lubricant known to man in the transmission may have shortened the life of the O-rings. But even with all the O-rings replaced, and the sump and filters thoroughly cleaned, the overdrive would fail after only a few miles, and the 20w50 oil I was using would be frothy with bubbles. I concluded it must be the pump that was bad, and that can only be replaced after the overdrive is removed from the rest of the transmission. I had to admit I was beyond my depth.

Geoff Rollert came to my rescue with a transmission and overdrive that had just been supposedly rebuilt. He made me a screamin' good deal to trade my old one for it. So I pulled the engine and transmission out of the car and exchanged transmissions. Then I re-installed it all in the car and took a test drive. Of course, all this was done over a few weeks time since I was busy and or lazy most days. Sadly, I discovered the new transmission was lacking both first and second gears. I did manage to limp around the neighborhood and determine that the overdrive did engage. Now I had a different problem, but I was still back to square one.

So the engine and transmission came back out and once I opened the top of the transmission, I could see the 1-2 shift fork was terribly worn and no longer moved the synchro hub far enough to engage first or second. Problem easily identified, but not so easily solved. In order to replace that shift fork, you need to remove the bell housing from one end of the transmission and the overdrive from the other end. Luckily, I had a spare transmission that was nearly new and had never been apart. So I tore into it to harvest the shift fork. Now I had two transmissions scattered across my garage floor. It was then that I discovered I didn't know exactly how all the shifter arms and legs and forks and spools and levers went back together. All those parts can be assembled in many combinations but only one of them will work. I consulted my manuals and they were of little help. Some adult words and an adult beverage seemed appropriate.

Eventually, I found the right combination and bolted everything back together. Once I got it all back into the car, I took it around the block and it all seemed to work as designed. Of course,

whenever I take that much apart, I always introduce a few new issues to be dealt with. The obvious ones have been resolved. But I wouldn't be surprised if a few more pop up when I hit the road in earnest. I plan some in-town drives as the weather permits to shake out little gremlins before venturing hundreds of miles from home. Over the course of the last few months, I have gotten to spend a lot of quality time in the garage with the Midget and learned more that I ever wanted to know about transmissions. I still know just barely enough to be dangerous. I am more than ready to spend some time driving and letting my skinned knuckles heal up.

In the photo you can see the slot in the 1-2 fork is 3 times as wide as the one in the 3-4 fork.







LOANER LIBRARY
