MOWOG

These letters are seen on cast metal parts of many British cars. Few people notice them and fewer still know what the strange combination of letters mean. To learn that, we need to go back to the days when automobiles were just starting to replace the horse for transportation. In the UK, just like in the USA, there were hundreds of companies making automobiles. Most made a handful and many made only a few hundred before failing or being bought out. In the USA, we know how Alfred Sloan combined car makers to form General Motors. In the UK, William Morris worked similar magic building his car-making empire and getting Knighted as Lord Nuffield. His basic car for the masses was named Morris. A slightly more upscale car was his Wolseley. And his sporty car brand was the MG, which everyone believes stood for Morris Garage. The founders stated officially that it was just two letters that stand for nothing in particular. The workers at MG and the locals referred to the factory as the 'G'.

We know how, in the USA, Henry Ford vertically integrated the auto industry buying his suppliers till his mines produced the ore that his ships carried to his smelters to make his steel for his car company. Morris did some of that as well. He may not have owned the mines, but he did own the foundries where metal parts were cast. And the name embossed on those parts was a combination of letters from his car companies, 'MO' for Morris, 'WO' for Wolseley, and 'G' for MG. Car makes were added and subtracted from his empire over the years, but the foundry kept the MOWOG brand.

So back about 25 years ago, the Kansas City MG Car Club was going to hold a planning meeting to schedule their events for the year. Back then, we tried to have one event every month. Bill Davidson volunteered to host the meeting at his house. He thought a name was needed and as usual, he was working on an MG in his garage. He spotted the MOWOG name cast into some part he was holding in his hand, and the rest is history.

This Month In MG History

Abingdon Spares December Newsletter

This month in MG History...December 1926, SU Carburetor Company becomes part the Morris Motors group, having been purchased by William Morris for the sum of £100,000. One of William Morris' business practices was to buy up his suppliers to expand and better control is automotive empire. Other Morris purchases early on included his radiator supplier, Osberton Radiators which became Morris Radiator Branch, an even complete manufacturers such as Wolseley Motors the following year. Although now part of the Morris group, SU continued business under their original name of SU Company, Ltd.

SU carburetors are of course well known to MG owners, having been used on MGs up through the 1970s. The SU is of course from the brothers Herbert and Carl Skinner who patented the constant-depression type of carburetor design in 1906. (Many may say the SU has led to periods of constant depression in their owner's lives, sorry, that was just too easy of a setup.) The carburetor design, in simple terms, relies on a tapered needle in a fixed sized jet to control the fuel delivery. The tapered needle, attached to a piston, rises and falls as the piston rises and falls based on airflow through the carburetor. This rising and falling either increases or decreases the amount of fuel available to the engine. There is a bit more to the process, but that is the basic idea.

Morris was already using the SU carburetors before the purchase. SU sales never rebounded after they switched to armament production during the first World War. At some point SU approached their biggest customer and agreed to a deal that would make them part of the Morris organization. Apparently, Morris thought the SU carburetor an excellent design and probably saved the company by his purchase and subsequent use of the carburetor on most models Morris produced.

Of course, if you follow the convoluted history of the Morris, Nuffield, Austin, British Leyland industries, somewhere along the line the original SU company was dissolved or liquidated, and somehow sold off.

The name and rights to produce the SU carburetor was purchased by the Burlen Fuel Systems in 1996. Burlen formed a new SU Carburetor Company Ltd. This new SU company continues to supply complete carburetors, fuel pumps, and associated replacement parts for the classic car market.

Last month, I talked about doing crude engine rebuilds as a teenager. And, of course, we did not have a vast selection of Snap On tools to work with. We used whatever we could "borrow" from our parents' tool collection. My dad was not a car guy or a mechanic. He didn't work on his own cars or household appliances. So he had very few tools, and some of what he had probably were "borrowed" from his dad.

He had cordless drills. A couple of old brace and bit hand-powered devices with a few dull bits that might have originally been able to bore holes in soft wood. He had a couple claw hammers and one old leather mallet. There were a few well-worn screw drivers covered in rust. I remember an old pair of straight jaw Vice Grips and a rusty pair of pliers. And for wrenches, there were pipe wrenches, a couple monkey wrenches, and one Crescent wrench.

For most jobs I wanted to do, working on our tired lawnmower motor or my bicycle, those were enough. But when I was around 10 or 11, I found my bike's handlebars were loose and I couldn't

turn the nut to tighten them anymore. The Crescent wrench just rounded the head of the bolt. So I used a ruler to see what size wrench I needed, took a handful of coins from my savings, and rode my bike to the Western Auto store to buy a 1/2" combination box and open end wrench. That did the job on the handlebars and started my tool collection.



Of course, I never throw anything away. It must have been good quality because I used it a lot back then, and still use it today. I even use Dad's Crescent wrench and the remains of one of the screw drivers that has been repurposed as an awl. I wonder how many others have tools over 70 years old down in the bottom of their tool boxes?





LOANER LIBRARY
