Cost of membership in the NAMGAR is \$37.50 North America/\$52.50 International per year and unique dash plaque indicating your car's Register number, NAMGAR's award winning magazine, *MGA!*, six times a year and other benefits.

The Kansas City MG Car Club is a chapter of the North American MGB Register. The North American MGB Register was formed in 1990 to serve the needs of MG owners throughout the world. The Register's executive committee is elected by the Affiliated Chapters. Officers can only serve two consecutive terms which ensures that new people and fresh ideas are always available. Finances are open to inspection at any time and the Treasurer provides financial statements that show how the membership's money is spent. Officers and Registrars receive no financial remuneration for their duties, but volunteer out of the spirit of the marque. The award-winning magazine *MG Driver* is published six times a year. Cost of membership in the NAMGBR is \$30.00 per year and includes a dash plaque with your membership number, the *MG Driver* magazine, and other benefits. (see namgbr.org)

Midget Mumbblings

Lately, the Midget hasn't been getting a lot of miles due to several factors including the weather. But when I do drive it, I am hearing a tick-tick under the bonnet that sounds like one valve. Lots of things could cause that, and most of those things are not good. I haven't adjusted the valves in a while, so perhaps a jamb nut has loosened and let the adjuster back out. Or maybe a worn rocker shaft and rocker arm are telling me they need replacing. Surely, a valve is not sticking in the guide since the noise is there when the engine is hot or ice cold. Whatever is causing the tick-tick needs to be looked after.

But the engine was rebuilt not that many miles ago, and only recently has started making the noise. I could think of nothing I have done to the engine that could have caused the problem. Usually, I discover a problem was caused as a side effect of something I have done. I wasted some time trying to remember even touching the engine. I checked and the tick-tick definitely is coming from the area of the rocker cover and seems a bit stronger at the front. But then I had an AHA! moment. I recalled seeing a bit of oil seep at the rear of the rocker cover, so I had given the nuts securing the cover another half turn or so to snug things just a bit. And after that is when the tick-tick was first noticed.

Several years back, I replaced the bright Chevy engine orange painted tin rocker cover with an expensive alloy cover. That cover has the same external dimensions as the stock tin one, but is made of thicker material. So the space inside is just a tad smaller. And when I bolted it in place, I heard one of the rockers barely ticking against it. Eventually, I found the tight spot and filed a bit of alloy away. Problem solved. But now the silicone gasket has been squished a bit more, allowing the cover to move ever so slightly closer to the head. And apparently that was just enough to eliminate any gap between moving parts and the cover. To test that theory, I loosened the securing nuts just a half turn while the engine was running. Sure enough, the tick-tick went away. So I removed the cover, and looking very very closely, I finally saw a faint indentation in the alloy where something had been tapping against it. I chucked a small grindstone into my drill and ground away a few thousandths of an inch. With the cover back on, I started the engine and there was no tick-tick. Even when I over-tightened the cover nuts, there was no tick-tick. Simple problem. Simple solution. Another happy ending.
