Midget Mumbblings

Everyone I know likes to talk about carburetors. I could tell you all I know about SUs and Zeniths in a very short amount of time. I know way less about Webers, so I won't even mention them. Variable venturi carbs like the SU and Zenith regulate fuel flow by having an air piston raise a tapered needle inside a jet. As the fatter part of the needle is lifted out of the jet, more fuel is allowed to be drawn into the carb. Needles are tapered differently to achieve different results. For the carb(s) on your car, there are dozens of choices for how the needle is tapered.

When our cars were designed, the very clever engineers spent a lot of time selecting the proper needle. In the late 1960s, the choice was influenced as much by emission laws as by getting the best performance and fuel economy. So even if your car is 100% pure stock, there may be a needle that offers better performance. Modern fuels may be slightly thinner in viscosity than what was around when the car was new, so flow through the jet may not be quite the same. And, of course, many of us have made some slight modifications, like changing cams and compression ratios and removing some external emission devices. Even just switching to a less restrictive air cleaner, or a more open exhaust, will change how the carb does its job.

So how is a person supposed to know which needle to buy? You could put a sniffer up the tail pipe and learn what the air-to-fuel ratio currently is. Of course, that isn't just important at idle. You want to know what that number is when the engine is under load. So you could book some time on a dyno. That usually mostly tells what the carb is doing at wide open throttle, but that is perhaps the most important condition. At least that gives you something measurable. Needle changes likely won't make a difference that you will easily feel in the seat of your pants. If you decide you need a richer mix, like most will, you can go to a needle with a slightly skinnier lower end. And if that helps, then go a step further that direction. Keep buying needles till you get to one that is too rich, and then back off to the one previous. All this trial and error will take time and cost you money.

Or like I did, you can consult various forums to see what others are having success with. Since their car and yours are probably not precisely alike, your results may not be the same. You can consult people who sell the needles and take advantage of their vast experience. I did all that and bought the first step richer from Joe Curto*. I probably should have gone up two steps. Or you could keep running whatever needles you currently have and just be happy that the car starts and runs. Your car probably already has power you don't often use on the street. When was the last time you had your right foot all the way to the floor with the tach at its red line?
