Jeff Givens' Member Garage Tour

On Saturday, March 29th, approximately 35 Triumph and MG Club members met at "Fort Givens", the home of Jeff and Mickie Givens, for a member garage tour. Jeff was a gracious host, furnishing coffee and doughnuts, and entertaining the group with his adventures with his 1963 ½ Ford Falcon Ventura Hardtop rally/race car and his 1959 Triumph TR3.

Jeff explained that, in 2021, after participating in some rallies in his TR3 in Europe, he decided to develop a US rally car and purchased the Falcon and began modifying it for that purpose. That process was interrupted in the fall of 2022 when the car was practically totaled and he was injured when he T-boned a car that ran a stop sign on a city street. After a period of recuperation and legal wrangling, he switched gears and decided to rebuild the Falcon as a race car and signed up for racing school and obtained an SCCA racing license.



Jeff related the trials and tribulations in restoring the Falcon, obtaining the license, and participation in racing events at Heartland Park in Topeka (now closed), Hedge Hollow near Adrian, MO, and Ozarks International Raceway near Gravois Mills, MO. Jeff is currently scheduled to race this year at Hedge Hollow on May 17th and 18th, and at Ozarks International July 4th through 6th, and October 11th and 12th.

As for the 1959 Triumph TR3, Jeff explained that he purchased it 1969 for \$37 while he was a young cadet in military school. The car was seriously dilapidated and barely ran. Then, not too long after he purchased it, he parked it in neutral without setting the brake and the next morning found it in a creek. That was the beginning of a love affair with the Triumph that has lasted 45 years, over 400,000 miles driven, and several restorations and engine rebuilds. Just recently, he had a leather interior kit from John Skinner, LTD in England, installed by Macy's Garage in Dayton, OH. At that time, he also added an original factory



radio, replace the top and tonneau, and had the side curtains rebuilt by the Roadster Factory. Despite its humble start, today the TR3 is a beautiful world class concours level car.



After the tour, most of the group when on a 20-minute drive to Flashbacks Restaurant in Tonganoxie where we found good food, good service, reasonable prices, and a lot of discussion and friendship with fellow club members. Thank you, Jeff, for planning and hosting this enjoyable event.

Ed Curry's Restoration Tech Session

On Saturday, April 20th, 21 MG and Triumph Club members and guests met at Ed Curry's shop located at Your Classic Ride. The Triumph Club furnished coffee and doughnuts. Ed started with a video review of some of his past restoration projects and then offered some restoration tips and discussed his current projects.

For those that did not attend, you missed an interesting and informative presentation. Ed specializes in taking barn finds and turning them into solid drivers. He currently has three cars in the shop – a small mouth Triumph TR3 that started as a rusted-out barn find that is now a beautiful fully restored car that took First In Class at the 2024 Heartland All British show, and two recent barn finds – a Triumph TR3A and a Triumph TR4, both in the early stages of restoration.





Ed's current emphasis is on the TR3A. He has the engine running (which idled amazingly smooth) and the work on hydraulics and brakes is substantially complete. One of the next challenges is the knocking sound in the transmission while in reverse.

Ed shared several tips that he has learned doing his restoration work, including rebuilding brake calipers, patching and resealing gas tanks, clearing clogged fuel and brake lines, and bench testing generators.

Lastly, Ed expressed his concerns that the consolidation of the major British parts vendors and trade issues with China is adversely affecting price, quality, and availability of restoration parts, while at the same time the end resale market is getting softer.

Ed, thank you for hosting this tech session and sharing your knowledge and experience.

Midget Mumblings

I recently encountered an electrical gremlin. I was checking the lights on the Midget and discovered that I had headlights only on low beam. The last thing I had done was replace the choke cable and to do that, I had removed the speedometer from the dash to get some access. Even the headlight switch had been removed to get a second finger to the back side of the dash where the nut for the choke cable assembly is inconveniently placed. But after a half day and a blood sacrifice or two, that simple 30-minute job had been successfully completed. So when the lights had a problem, I immediately thought I must have loosened a wire around the switch. Had I bothered to look at a wiring diagram, I would have seen only a single wire from the switch to the lights carried current for both high and low beams, so that could not have been the

problem. After this false start, I looked under the bonnet where I had installed a headlight relay kit years ago that I bought on sale at Victoria British. It has one relay for the high beams and another for the low beams. With the lights switched on, I moved the dimmer lever and felt each of those relays click. After some head scratching and checking with my meter, I decided to try swapping one of those relays with the other one. And the trouble moved from high beam to low beam. I had isolated the cause to a bad relay. But these are not the standard relays available at any parts store or salvage yard. They function the same, but are shaped differently and plug into a smaller multi-pin plug in their wiring harness.



But since I know how a relay works, I decided I might as well try to fix this bad one. I was able to pry off the cover fairly easily and get a look at the guts. I noticed a bit of corrosion, which is not uncommon since these relays were never advertised as water proof. And sure enough, the contacts that close when the relay is powered were not clean. I cut a tiny strip of fine sand paper and slipped it between the contacts and proceeded to wipe one side and then the other. And when I put everything back together again, the problem had indeed been solved.

The reason I had installed this relay kit in the first place is that I was replacing the headlight bulbs with much brighter ones and they would of course draw more power. They were halogen, and not the more modern LEDs. Even the standard bulbs put a lot of load on the rather fragile switch, so I needed a robust circuit that would deliver full power to the bulbs without overloading the switch. I have added relays to other circuits for the same reason. In case you might want to add a relay to something on your car, it is really simple. The most common relays have only four pins and they are numbered 30, 85, 86, and 87. And there is usually a diagram printed right on the relay showing which number does what. All you need to do is cut the wire leading to the device and put female connectors on each end. Then make up a ground wire with a female terminal on one end and a ring terminal on the other to screw onto the body of the car in some handy spot. Lastly, you will need to create a power wire that, per British code, should be brown with a female terminal on one end, an inline fuse, and I use a ring terminal on the other end. That attaches to the big brown battery cable at the starter solenoid bolt. Now attach these four wires to the relay. 85 is the ground. 86 is your wire from the switch. 87 is your wire to the device. 30 is the hot wire from the battery. The switch on the dash now carries only the tiny amount of current needed to activate the relay and the device gets as much current as it needs from the battery. Any parts house has crimp-on terminals, inline fuses, and 4-pin relays in their electrical aisle. Most of those relays are rated at 30 or 40 amps. They can handle way more current than any devices on our cars except the starter. I recently found that online I could buy a 5-pack of relays and pre-wired sockets for about what a single relay costs me locally. If I were not already wired up, I would surely go with those. Of course, relays do add a bit of complexity and another point of possible failure to our wiring that already mystifies many of us. But popping off the cover of a failing relay to burnish the points isn't rocket science. Even I have managed to do it.

This Month In MG History

This month in MG History......April 1956, Bresica, Italy, the 33rd running of the Mille Miglia. The MG factory entered two MGAs. The cars were fitted with larger fuel tanks, oil coolers and higher axle rations, but beyond those options, were basically standard MGAs. Both cars were painted red, not the traditional BRG. It was from this 1956 race, it is rumored, that driver Peter Scott-Russell claimed to be the one who persuaded BMC to paint their rally cars red rather than green. It was thought that the race officials made sure the railroad crossings were left up for red, Italian, cars, and always seemed to have a train coming when a French blue, BRG or German silver car approached. Whether this is true or not, from this race on BMC rally cars competed in red with white roofs. How well this strategy worked we may never know.

The race was dominated by Ferrari which took the first five places, the winner averaging 85 mph. The MG team did well, placing second and third in class. Car 227, (MBL 867) was driven by Nancy Mitchell and Pat Faichney. Car 229, (MJB 167) was driven by Peter Scott-Russell and Tom Haig. The weather was not ideal for such a race, apparently heavy rain was present for most of the race. In car 227, Mitchell drove the entire 1000 miles (the MGA was not fitted with a windshield, only a tiny aeroscreens). At the conclusion of the rally, both drivers, exhausted and soaked, had to be lifted from the car. Mitchell placed 3rd in class, and was also the highest placed woman in the rally. This was one of Nancy Mitchel's greatest drives. Car 229, driven by Scott-Russell and Haig, finished ahead of 227, to take 2nd in class. Scott-Russell also drove the entire race himself.

Since BMC had frowned on racing activities following the 1955 Le Mans disaster, rallying was now in a grey area for the Abingdon Competitions department. Rather than displaying the successful rally cars in their London showroom, John Thornley ordered the cars quickly returned to Abingdon without any fanfare! Best to keep BMC management out of the loop.

The 1956 event was the second to last running of the traditional Mille Miglia. The weather conditions of 1956 race resulted in many wrecks and deaths. The increasing speeds of the entrants, combined with the huge numbers of spectators crowding the course, was drawing criticism from racing organizations and the Italian government. The 1957 Mille Miglia would be the last running of the race over the traditional course. The horrible crash that year, killing nine spectators and injuring many more, as well as the driver and navigator, marked the end of the traditional race. Shortly after the race, the Italian government banned racing on public roads, so ending the most famous and demanding Italian road race.


